Courses Developed

University of Idaho, College of Art and Architecture, Landscape Architecture Program

History of Landscape Architecture, LARC 389, 3 credits

Survey course providing an overview of the history of landscape architecture, with a focus on Prehistory and Ancient Civilizations, the Middle Ages, the Renaissance, the Asian Gardens, the English Landscape Garden, the birth of Landscape Architecture, Modernism and the contemporary trends.

Introduction to Landscape Architecture, Larc 151, 3 credits

Introductory course on the theory and the main fields of research and application of the discipline of Landscape Architecture

Urban Systems in Ecology, LARC 481, 3 credits

New course focused on planning of cities, including urban forms and spatial organization, and the emerging fields of urban ecology and ecological design.

It introduces methodologies to analyze and evaluate urban environments using the criteria of ecological, social and cultural sustainability; and methods to develop a master plan for an urban case study, from site-inventory to site-assessment, vision and proposal.

Origins of Landscape Form, LARC 254, 3 credits

Introduces methods of form-generation for spatial design, with sketches, photomontages and modelling at various scales and with different media. The course explores materiality, form-evolution, space, scale, and teaches students to express an idea from concept to tangible space, and eventually apply this knowledge into a physical context.

Landscape Architecture Studio 6 LARC 455; Studio 7 and 8 LARC 463/ 465; Graduate Studio 2 LARC 556; Graduate Studio 3 LARC 558, 6 credits; Studio 3 and 4, LARC 454/462, 6 credits

Introduction of methodologies for landscape analysis, including site-surveys and archival research, landscape assessment, design and planning of urban cultural landscapes (case studies: Northern Idaho's railroad towns – Moscow, Colfax and Palouse rail corridors).

Explores techniques of landscape–representation (transect-sections, mapping and overlapping of maps to investigate the relationships between the ecological, cultural, social, historical layers; sketching, comparative visual analysis, 3D-imaging, collage and photomontage, modelling. The emphasis is on landscape representation and communication, and the design process is reality-based, with service-learning projects and collaborations with local city councils.

Landscape Architecture Studio I LARC 353/450, 6 credits

Explores the practice of temporary urbanism, involving students in the construction of temporary urban interventions in urban public space. This exercise introduces the idea of design as process, involving conceptualization, programming, construction and de-installation, as well as repetition, recycling, reversibility, mobility etc. Students practice community engagement through the venue of projects that promote an interaction with residents, and application of design skills in a reality charged environment.

Landscape Architecture Summer Study Abroad in Italy

The program is designed to provide an immersive experience of the Italian cultural landscape, by blending a general culture course with an urban theory module and a design studio. Courses taught:

The Italian Experience - Landscape, Language and Culture, LARC 382, 2 credits

Italian Hill Towns and Urban Centers LARC 390/490, 3 credits

Urban theory course that explores Italian cultural landscapes (including hill towns, historic and contemporary villas and gardens, archaeological parks) and the techniques set in place by the authorities for their conservation and enhancement.

The module introduces the historical evolution of the concepts of urban design, garden design and landscape planning in Italy, through readings and the study of management plans for Italian cultural landscapes, including Italian planning policies promoting ecological, cultural and social sustainability. Classes encourage place-based learning and take the form of on-site discussions, with students themselves presenting various topics related to localized case studies; the goal is to encourage an attitude of proactive learning, and of group-work.

Summer Study Abroad Design Studio LARC 364/564, 6 credits

The design studio takes place in an Italian cultural landscape (summer 2017– Monferrato vineyards in northern Italy; since summer 2018–Recanati historic hill town). Students explore local management

policies regarding cultural landscape planning (regulatory plans) and engage in contextual and historical analysis of the place. Readings introduce concepts of urban and landscape design: place making, imageability, site-specificity, regionalism, which are elaborated in the production of a site-specific design. The design studio includes the conceptualization and construction with students of site-specific temporary installations.

Introduction to Landscape Architecture (Undergraduate Lecture and Tutorial Class) AR1724, 8 credits (average 160 students)

Introductory course (undergraduate) to the methods for landscape analysis and landscape representation, consisting of lectures and practical seminars directed by teaching assistant. The module has used social networking tools such as Facebook and blogs to encourage proactive feedback as a means of sharing students' works.

Specifically, the design focuses on green architecture and has addressed the typologies of housing, commercial, hospital, as well as urban design.

The module introduces the concepts of cultural tourism and cultural heritage, and management of cultural heritage in relation to the four themes of cultural landscape, archaeological sites, parks and historic gardens, historic cities. Students are required to formulate a management plan for a cultural heritage site in Rome by presenting an integrated strategy for its conservation, management and presentation to the public. In 2010, the students conceptualized the management plan of the 'Testaccio Territorial Museum' in Rome.
