BACHELOR OF GENERAL STUDIES REQUIREMENTS

- Complete at least 120 credits
- A minimum of 45 credits must be earned in upper division courses (at least 30 from U of I)
- No more than 36 credits in any one subject can be used toward the degree

**** IMPORTANT ****

Students working toward the B.G.S. must look ahead to see in which departments they wish to accumulate the required 45 credits in upper division courses. Many upper division courses have prerequisites. If planning is delayed, some courses may be unavailable until prerequisites have been taken.

Students in the General Studies program may transfer to any degree program at any time if they satisfy the GPA and curricular requirements of that program.

To tailor your degree program, you can complete a minor, certificate or area of emphasis.

- Students planning on transferring to U of I are advised to complete an A.A. (minimum 60 credits) at NIC
