Are you a military veteran or family member interested in learning how to grow your own food or start a small farm?

How about feeding the hungry in our community, connecting with other local veterans, all while enjoying the health benefits of getting your hands in soil?

The Harvest Heroes Veteran Beginning Farming and Gardening Program offers accessible, family friendly, season-long training and mentoring for a real world, hands-on experience planning, growing, & harvesting fresh fruits & vegetables.

Harvest Heroes learn the basics of good growing, then work as a team to transform a neighborhood garden; improving personal health while feeding themselves and those in need.

In depth sessions on seed starting, Learn by doing: soil prep, seeding, Learn the science behind transplanting, greenhouse work, tillage, cover soils, botany, market family garden planning, small gardening, soil, weeds, business development, harvesting, cropping, weed ID, season extension, crop insects, and more food safety, cooking and preserving rotation, crop protection, harvesting, fresh fruits and vegetables packaging, food donation and distribution

Materials cost for the entire season is only \$65 per family.
